From the Kitchen

Did you know that both red and white clovers that you find in your yard are edible? Some folks use the flowers to make a clover jelly or steep them in water to make tea! The leaves of the red clover can also be dried and used as a vanilla extract substitute. All above-ground (aerial) parts of white and red clover plans are edible: Flower, leaves, stem, and seeds. Clover flowers are the tastiest part of the plant with a bit of sweetness to them. The flavor is reminiscent of fresh green beans or snap peas.

* Warning! Do not eat any plants that have been sprayed with any type of weed killer! **
